The Dragons Development Girls Red and Green Teams can together feel very proud of the results at the Broadland 7-a-side Tournament on 16 June, with 18 players representing the club.

The teams can be forgiven for being somewhat rusty, with several of the players not having picked up a hockey stick since March. In order to get some reasonable balance into the two sides, some players switched squads and others played in unfamiliar positions after a warm up session on Sunday. It is worth looking closely at the table of results below to see just how comparable the results were.

Red Dragons won the tournament with 13 points, with their nearest rivals City Tigers on 9 points. Two Red Dragons were up on the podium amongst the four players who shared top spot as leading scorers with 3 goals - salute Lucy Morton and Lara Taylor. Lucy as captain then stepped up to receive the shield on behalf of the Dragons for the first time. Dereham and Norwich City having each previously held the trophy for three consecutive years.

Thanks to Ally Windsor-Waite who stepped up to manage Green Dragons (wearing red and white socks), just to differentiate them from the Red Dragons who had green socks and wore the dreaded green bibs. Thanks to Jane Morton, perhaps doing her last co-ordination duties for the dev team, and to Johanne Steward who assisted and who will be getting more involved in the new season.

This was a tournament which rattled on at a fast pace, with the matches of 12 minutes one-way keeping players and coaches on their toes to settle quickly, take their chances, make their subs and any playing adjustments. Dragons can be notoriously slow to get the flames going. Red Dragons know they should have scored far more goals - but well done in particular to the Dereham and Watton goalkeepers who were brave shot-stoppers. Green Dragons created fewer chances, but scored excellent goals. Heather Tasker's winner against Watton was a super effort. Heather was captain for the night and led by example. The Green Dragons were so unlucky to lose to Dereham by a single goal in the last minute, when a draw would surely have boosted their confidence as well as their final placing.

Dereham had already given the Red Dragons a hard time, which some very strong running down the right giving Catherine Matthews plenty to cope with. As a new defender, Catherine needed plenty of support from Carmel Windsor-Waite and after the Reds conceded one goal - when a hard cross was not picked up - this pairing were seldom threatened for the rest of the tournament. The Red goals versus Dereham came from Sophie Thurtell, playing in the unpopular left mid slot, who swept home in style (and in her other matches Sophie was unlucky not to score again, taking up some excellent positions). Brooke Simmons also played left mid and also went close, the near post intervening twice when a goal looked certain. Brooke and Sophie also made solid contributions in tackles and short accurate passes. Brooke and Sophie, Lara and Anna Brook made a very strong midfield full of attacking runs. The winner against Dereham came from Lucy Morton who began to exploit gaps in the middle.

City Tigers held the Reds to a goalless draw, with the Reds nearly engineering their own downfall by failing to take their opportunities. Green Dragons did very well against the Tigers, with Jodie Rump opening the scoring, but the Tigers just managed to wear them down 2-1..

Watton had an excellent shot-stopping goalkeeper and some very young players. Greens beat them 1-0. Reds were held for most of the match but it was Lara Taylor who broke the deadlock. Her second goal was a beauty, luring the goalie into making a dive before calmly lifting the ball over her head.

City Lions were another team who mounted a strong challenge. Anja Wimmer got Greens goal in a 1-1 draw with a thumping shot which is rapidly becoming her trademark. Reds managed keep a clean sheet, and their winner was a most cheeky goal from Alice Young who finished a three-player move with a clean sweep from the right across the goal and in.

Match of the tournament was, of course, Reds v Greens. Reds thought they had the form but were a little apprehensive. Greens were unlucky to meet them at the end of the evening when Reds were starting to make their shots count. Mollie only goes between the posts on special occasions nowadays, and fortunately was willing to step in because we were a goalie short. She kept four clean sheets, thanks in part to some excellent teamwork with Carmel and Catherine.
